AT **CAUCUS**, each precinct will elect 1 or 2 **Precinct Committee People (PCP's)**. PCP's will represent their precinct as voting members of the **Boulder County Republican Central Committee**. A good PCP is "The most influential political officer in the world."

### ***A good Precinct Committeeperson will:***

Regularly attend GOP District Meetings . Regularly attend Community Meetings  
Conduct Neighborhood Canvass . Organize Voter Registration Efforts  
Distribute Candidate Literature . Coordinate Get Out the Vote Efforts  
Help Build and Grow the Party


At **CAUCUS**, you'll meet neighbors who are also affiliated as Republicans, sign up if you'd like to be hired by Boulder County as a Republican Election Judge and sign up if you'd like to volunteer as an Election Watcher for the Boulder County Republican Party.

**Boulder County Republican Caucuses**, run by the Boulder County Republican Party (BCR), are held at about 16 ADA compliant locations throughout the county. A general opening session is held at each location before electors go into their individual Precinct Caucuses.

**2019 Boulder County GOP Central Committee** meeting: PCP's will elect the BCR Chairman, 3 Vice Chairmen, a Secretary and Bonus Members. These officers will be voting members of the State GOP Central Committee.


**2019 Legislative District Meetings:** PCP's will elect a Chairman, Vice Chairman and Secretary for their Legislative District and Judicial District 20. Bonus Members are elected for CD2 and CD4.

**2019 State Central Committee (SCC)** meeting: Members will elect the State Chairman, Vice Chairman and Secretary and vote on bylaws and whether or not to opt out of semi-open primaries. Districts will elect representatives to the State Executive Committee.

## GOVERNMENT BEGINS AT CAUCUS

AT **CAUCUS**, each precinct will discuss state-wide candidates and issues, hold a GOP Governor candidate straw poll, vote on resolutions to forward to the County Assembly, and elect Delegates and Alternates to represent the precinct at the Boulder County GOP Assembly. (Alternates fill empty Delegates seats.)

### **BOULDER COUNTY GOP ASSEMBLY:**

Saturday, 3-24-2018 at Skyline High School. Delegates nominate candidates for county offices for Primary election, vote on resolutions for presentation at the State Assembly and elect Delegates and Alternates to the State Assembly.

### ***Boulder County Offices up for election:***

District 3 County Commissioner (must live in District), Assessor, Coroner, Clerk & Recorder, Surveyor, Sheriff, Treasurer. Are YOU a potential candidate?

### **Assemblies held in conjunction with the 2018 Boulder County Assembly:**

HDs 10, 11 and 12—Delegates nominate candidates for Primary Election.  
SH 16 and HDs 13 and 33—Delegates and Alternates are elected for these multi-county Districts. Multi-County District meetings are held in conjunction with the GOP State Assembly on 4-13-2018.

**CD2 and CD4 ASSEMBLIES:** Friday, 4-13-2018. Delegates nominate Primary Candidates for US Congress and the CO State Board of Education.

### **COLORADO GOP STATE ASSEMBLY AND CONVENTION:**

Saturday, 4-14-2018 at CU Boulder Coors Event Center. Delegates nominate candidates for state offices for primary ballot, and vote on resolutions.

### ***State Offices up for election:***

Governor, Lt. Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Attorney General, Regent of the University of Colorado.

**Primary Elections:** 6-26-2018. Registered Republicans, Democrats and Unaffiliated electors will receive mail-in ballots.

Please be aware that the 2022 Colorado primary election results are likely not [certifiable](#). Canvass board members have already been selected and will [meet prior to July 20<sup>th</sup>](#). Their sole purpose will be to verify and certify, OR NOT, the primary election results.

### **The current design of the election system is not certifiable for known reasons:**

- SOS Wayne Williams acknowledged - [who voted on mail-in ballots cannot be verified](#)
- You cannot verify that the voters voted by secret ballot
- [Same day voter registration makes it difficult to verify voter eligibility](#)
- Motor Voter registration enables non-citizens to vote
- The drop boxes are not secure ([2000 Mules](#))
- The electronic election machinery used in Colorado elections is [illegal](#)
- Colorado Secretary of State is currently being [sued for inaccurate voter roles](#)
- Colorado Secretary of State is currently being sued for [not properly certifying machines, destroying election records, and unlawfully banning audits](#).

# OVERVIEW OF CERTAIN COLORADO ELECTION PROCESSES

Traditionally, voting has been conducted in neighborhood precinct, supervised and conducted by political party-appointed electors (Judges) from the neighborhood, and open to the public for poll watching, challenge, and participation in the resolution of problems.

The voting and counting processes were performed in a secure facility that was protected from electioneering. Strict attention was paid to security, elector eligibility, ballot chain of custody, transparency, opposing-party judges, anonymous votes, and accuracy at each step.

The so-called modernized election system has eliminated most of the protections of the traditional election system.

- Every ineligible vote counted or eligible vote miscounted disenfranchises an eligible elector and overrides that elector's vote.
- It is UNKNOWN whether the ballot sent to a remote elector actually got to the elector, or whether the ballot cast by an elector actually arrived into the custody of election officials. Was it lost, delayed, stolen?

In the following two charts, compare the Traditional Voting processes against the Modernized Voting processes. Pay special attention to the chain of custody, election records created, verifiability, and transparency. The following should occur in all election systems:

When and where does each process take place?

---

What are the opportunities for poll watching?

---

Elector Identity – is this person who they claim to be?

---

Elector Eligibility – does this person meet the voting and contest requirements?

---

Issue ballot – is there a pollbook record of who got what ballot?

---

In private voting booth: mark and verify votes.

---

Judge verifies that ballot style is correct, then removes and retains ballot stub.

---

Voter cast anonymous ballot into secure ballot box.



Close of polls – voter count, ballot shuffle, cast ballot count, interpretation and count of votes. Judges' report. Publicly post results.

# TRADITIONAL VOTING – PAPER BALLOT IN-PERSON AT PRECINCT ON ELECTION DAY

The Chain of custody of ballots is tight from the delivery of ballots to officials through the counting of votes and the transfer of cast ballots and election records from the precinct to the central site.

To cheat would be very risky because there are witnesses at every step.

# MODERNIZED VOTING - REMOTE VOTING

## Remote voting

Colorado's remote-voting election system has sacrificed election security, accuracy, and transparency in favor of a system designed to maximize voter participation. Colorado's "modernized" system has

1. eliminated the ballot chain-of-custody protocols,
2. essentially eliminated voter identity and eligibility tests in favor of allowing anybody to vote, and
3. replaced the traditional system without first designing, testing, and certifying a complete remote voting system.

Election laws and the rules have not overcome the realities of distance and time. This chart does not include Fax, Email, Online, and In-Person voting.





2010 General Election Audit Board Statement

The audit of the 2010 General Election discovered two differences in 40,663 audited ballot contents. Both resulted from voter intent resolution differences between the resolution and audit teams. One was identified on County Issue 1B and the other was identified on the County Coroner race.

Statistical analysis was completed on all content outcomes to include the impact of difference. No impact was found in any content outcome and the audit board does not recommend any recounts for the general election.

Opposition to Proposed Rule 1.1.8 July 25, 2016

Dear Secretary of State Williams,

We do not accept CDOS's Orwellian double-speak proposed as the new Rule 1.1.8 "Ballots Cast" definition. We begin by identifying four problems with the proposed terminology. After discussion, we offer a temporary, albeit imperfect, work-around for the November 2016 election.

The following discussion relates also to proposed Rules 1.1.44, 10.5.2(b), 10.11.2(a), and 21.4.15(d)(5).

1. Attempting to redefine the commonly understood word "cast" is a horrible suggestion. If adopted, we would have to accommodate to mind-bending acrobatics to distinguish between "cast" and "received."
2. There is a vital distinction between **BALLOTS CAST** and **BALLOTS RECEIVED**, and this distinction must be retained. "Ballots Cast" relates to something that electors are allowed to do; "ballots received" relates to something that election judges are allowed to do. The difference is as stark as the difference between a baseball pitcher and catcher. To speak of the catcher pitching and catching the ball is nonsensical. Exhibit 1 illustrates a few of the many nonsensical consequences.
3. The CDOS's proposed change disguises a major flaw in Colorado's election system. Such deception would directly violate CDOS's explicit statutory **duty** to enforce the provisions of the code and would misuse CDOS's statutory **power** to adopt rules necessary for the proper administration and enforcement of election laws. The law does not say that CDOS has the power to rewrite the code; see Exhibit 2: 1-1-107. Powers and duties of secretary of state, and Hanlen v. Gessler, 2014 CO 24, 333 P.3d 41.
4. Colorado's mail ballot system currently provides no chain-of-custody of ballots, has made no attempt to comply with the law requiring that it report the number of ballots cast by voters, and has made no provision for assessing the number of cast ballots that have been lost or stolen. In addition to potentially disenfranchising eligible electors, Colorado's election contest results are not trustworthy. In the recent Boulder County Primary election, 65% of the issued ballots were not returned. Lost or stolen cast ballots may have overturned an election contest. For example, the House District 10 contest for the Democratic Party Primary was won by 212 votes, but there were about 16,000 ballots not returned, and it is UNKNOWN how many of the unreturned ballots were actually cast ballots that were lost or stolen.

Colorado's non-compliance with the requirement to report the number of ballots cast is not a new problem to CDOS. Boulder County Canvass Boards have reported this issue for years, and nothing has been done to address this violation of the law. The problem is not just the missing report of ballots cast. Without knowing the number of ballots cast, Colorado's election system cannot be verified as secure and accurate.
